TOPIC: Word Families -ock


FACT/ TIP: Word families are groups of words that have something in common. Word families usually have the same end sound.


GRAMMAR

TOPIC: Singular and Plural

FACTS/TIPS: Singular and plural are used when counting nouns.

Singular tells that there is only one (1) of the noun.

- Some nouns are made plural by adding '-es' to the end of the word. E.g. dress dresses dish dishes
- We add -es to words ending with -ch, -sh, -x, -o, -s and -ss.
