TOPIC: Word Families -ock


**FACT/ TIP**: Word families are groups of words that have something in common. Word families usually have the same end sound.



### **TOPIC: Singular and Plural**

**FACTS/TIPS:** Singular and plural are used when counting nouns.

# Singular tells that there is only one (1) of the noun.

one (1) dress





- Some nouns are made plural by adding '-es' to the end of the word. E.g. dress dresses dish dishes
- We add -es to words ending with -ch, -sh, -x, -o, -s and -ss.

## Make the following nouns plural by adding '-es'
