### TOPIC: Subject & Verb Agreement -Was & Were

FACTS/TIPS: The noun and verb must agree.

When the noun is one or singular the verb 'was' is used.

When the noun is more than one or plural the verb 'were' is used.



The boy **was** eating.



The boys **were** eating.
